Underthepolicyoftheuniversity, students enjoy the greatest degree of lib ertyconsistent with highacademic standards and orderly conduct. Each student is expected to conduct himself suchamannerastoupholdthegoodreputationoftheUniversity(andhis/herfel lowstudents). At the same time, he/ she should be conscious of his/her responsibilities imposed by andtheidealsproclaimedbytheUniversity.Itispresumedthatallstudents,as membersofthis Institutionofthehighestlearning understandthatmaturity, responsibility due regard for rights ofothersareprerequisitesofliberty. The following rules are to be observed by the estudents for cherishing the noblecause of the university.

Eachstudentisrequiredtopunctuallyattendalllectures,practicalclasse sandtutorials heldoneachworkingday. Astudentwhodisturbsthelectureorbehaves indecently in a class may be expelled from the class by the teacher. Astudentso expelled shall be deemed to be absent for the day.

Everystudentshallpossessthenecessarybooksandotherarticlesrequire dtopursuehis/ herstudies in theuniversity. Every student who borrows books or any otherequipment is responsiblefortheirpreservationingoodcondition and in the event of their being lost tordamaged.

He/sheshallberequiredtoreplacethemordefraytheircost. Anystudentwhobrea ksordamages university 'spropertyshallbe requiredtopaythecostoftherepairorreplacement. Incase of willfuldamage, he/sheshallalsobe punished in such a manner as the Principal may think fit. Consumption of alcohol or other intoxicating drinks, drugs on the campus or entering thecampusina

stateofintoxicationisprohibitedandviolationofthisruleshallattractserious disciplinaryaction.

Studentsshallnotholdmeetingsforcriticizingthepoliciesandactionsoft heuniversity

orcollegeauthorities.SuchmeetingsshallbedeemedtobeunlawfulandthePrincipalmighttake

suchactionasheconsidersnecessarytoprohibitsuchmeetingsortopunishtheo ffendersandin

caseheconsidersitnecessary/serioushemayreportthemattertotheVice-Chancellor.

ThePrincipalmayprohibitthestudentsfromattendingpoliticalorsuchothe rmeetingsifhe apprehendsabreach ofpeaceinthe campus.Thestudentswhoact asvolunteersin socialservices activitiestakenupinconnectionwithapoliticalmeetingshouldnotparticipateint heproceedings

of such meetings. The volunteers shall on no count be used for political purposes.

verypoororwhoseconductisdissatisfactory. Then ames of students who are found in corrigible even afterwarnings may be removed from the rolls after intimation to the respective embassies.

Thenamesofstudentsoftheuniversitycollegewhoisonstrikeorfoundg uiltyofserious

indisciplineshallautomaticallyberemovedfromtherollsandtheyshallnotordinarilybereadmitted and inno case with retrospective effect.

Organizing any religious meeting / function / display of religious symbols in a public or openplaceintheuniversitycampus,includinghostels,isstrictlyprohibited.An yviolationofthis ruleshallbeconstrued asanactofindisciplineanddisciplinaryactionwillbetakenagainstpersons concernedapartfrominitiatingappropriatelegalproceedings.

Students going on strike or in any way guilty of serious breach of discipline, if they are residentsoftheattachedhostels, shall be required to quit the hostels at 12 hours' notice and they shall not ordinarily be readmitted to the privileges of residence in the hostel. In case they are readmitted, they shall pay admission fees.

Studentsindulginginanyviolentactivities,voluntarilyorunder,coercion,di rectorindirect, orfound pressurizingthe college oruniversityauthoritiesto meet their demandswill bepunishedbythe universityinaccordancewiththeexistingrulesandregulations.

The Principal may, on the recommendation of the Head of the Departme

nt,orotherwise inflict the following punishments in the interests of the students or the institution: fine, loss of attendance,lossofterm,suspension,expulsion;orsuchotheractionasdeem ednecessaryfor the maintenance of discipline on the campus.

Ragginginanyformintheuniversitypremisesisconsideredtobeanoffencepunishable underlaw.Ragginginitspresentformisadeliberatedehumanizationofthehumanvaluesandthe cultureofliving together with a purposeful goal. Ragging both in and outside the campus has been banned. Students involved in any form of ragging will be expelled from the institution by the principalandtheywillbe subject to punishment as per civil law.
