INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

1. Genesis:

Acharya Nagarjuna University is named after Acharya Nagarjuna - one of the most brilliant preceptors and philosophers - whose depth of thought, clarity of perception and spiritual insight was such that even after centuries, he is a fount of inspiration to a vast number of people in many lands. The University is fortunate to be situated on the very soil where he was born and had lived, a soil made more sacred by the aspiration for light and a state of wholesomeness by generations of students. It is the profound wish of the people of the area that this University one day raises to the level of the yesteryear Nalanda and Taxashila.

Established in 1976, the University has completed 42 years under the stewardship of successive Vice-Chancellors. The University has been accredited with A grade (3.08 CGPA) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council in December 2016. Situated between the cities of Vijayawada and Guntur in Andhra Pradesh on Calcutta and Chennai National Highway (N.H-5), its Campus is spread over an area of 270 acres. Quantitative expansion and qualitative improvements on various academic fronts have been made possible through the efforts of its dedicated faculty, an efficient team of supporting staff and high quality students input.

2. University Emblem – what it signifies:



The crest and the motto adopted by the Acharya Nagarjuna University represent the creative essence of Indian culture oriented to the contemporary aspirations. The symbolism is based on the concepts that all human excellence proceeds from truth and culminates in truth. The individual symbols in the crest are emblematically related to one another so as to suggest the upward evolution of the life force from material plenitude and manifest reality towards spiritual magnificence and universal consciousness.

The young initiated into knowledge at the University shall achieve identity, growth, self-differentiation and fulfillment in the various ascensions of intellectual and spiritual states shown in the symbolic scheme of the crest.

The vase of plenty (PURNA-GHATA) is a prototype from the Amaravati sculpture of the early centuries of

the Christian era. It stands for material prosperity on the one hand and objective knowledge on the other its traditional attributes are *sasya* (fertility), *sanatana* (increase), *sampat* (prosperity) and *samridhi* (plentitude). The vase is also a paradigmatic representation of the Universe and the creative cycle according to ancient Indian scriptures. Its face is Vishnu, the sustainer, its neck *Rudra*, the apocalyptic transformer; its base is Brahma, the creator.

Arising out of the superabundant water of life sprouting from *purna ghata* and transcending the mundane level, illuminated by the resplendent halo of the Sun, is the freshly blossoming Lotus. The pool of waters (*manasa sarovara*) symbolizes the creative. On the apex are the dharma-chakra and the Lotus representing the creative evolution symbolized by the solar orb.

On the apex are the dharma-chakra (the wheel of eternal law) flanked by *harinas* (deer), overarched by the *visva-padma* (the cosmic Lotus) flanked by *makaras* (symbols of the cosmic consciousness). The dharma chakra is reminiscent not only of *rita* but also of the Buddha's promulgation of the law (*dharma chakrapravartana*). The deers, too, have a two-fold connotation. On the one hand, they represent beatitude, and on the other, the highest point of universal consciousness.

The motto, '*Satye Sarvam Pratishitam*' is an epigrammatic representation of the entire symbolism of the crest. It is singularly appropriate to the ideals and functions of the University, which is dedicated to the pursuit which is the Ultimate abode of all.

3. About the University:

The University started as an affiliating University with only 10 Postgraduate courses in the University College, which have been in existence right from 1967, when it was a part of the Andhra University Post- Graduate Centre at Nallapadu, Guntur. The University at present offers Postgraduate education in 70 courses, besides Postgraduate courses in affiliated colleges. Administration of the existing courses of the campus college is redistributed into three constituent colleges: i) College of Arts, Commerce & Law, ii) College of Sciences, iii) College of physical education and sports sciences from the academic year 2010-11.

The University College of Engineering and Technology established in 2009-10 offers instruction for B.Tech. in CSE, ECE, EEE, Civil, Mechanical and M.Tech., in Computer Science, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Structural Engineering

and Power Systems. The College of Pharmaceutical Sciences established in 2009-10 offers M.Pharmacy programme in five specializations, along with B.Pharmacy. The University College of Architecture and Planning with B.Arch. programme also started functioning from the academic year 2010-11. These initiatives reflect the importance attached by the University to offer technical and professional education.

The University has been constantly striving towards achieving progress and expansion during all these years, in terms of introducing new courses in the University College, the affiliated colleges and professional colleges. This University has also pioneered the introduction of self-financing courses in conformity with the thinking of the national educational policy-making bodies such as the University Grants Commission. The resources mobilized through these courses have been utilized for strengthening the existing faculties and starting of new disciplines in the self-financing mode.

The University has encouraged several colleges within its jurisdiction to introduce job-oriented and add-on courses at the Undergraduate and Post-graduate levels. For this purpose, the University has organised a workshop on Restructuring of undergraduate courses and designed several new combinations which enjoyed popularity with the affiliated colleges. The University has always been proactive in implementing the Model curricula developed by UGC/NCTE/AICTE/PCI. Academic autonomy has so far been extended to eight of the affiliated colleges as per the direction of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi. Steps are continuously being taken to implement the reports of various Committees to evolve a pattern of restructured courses keeping in view the demands of depth and direction and the need for academic freedom and creativity in all the courses of study offered by the University. In the pursuit of Quality drive, the University has been encouraging every affiliated college to opt for Accreditation from NAAC. The University has organized several workshops for Principals, Secretaries and Correspondents to drive home the necessity. So far 30 colleges affiliated to the University have been accredited (four of them at A Level) by the NAAC. Still there is a long way to go in this regard.

Teaching and Research are the two eyes and twin goals of the faculty in the University College. The academic Departments seek to find a reasonable and useful balance between the world of knowledge and its use and application in more concrete and realizable form. The research programmes and course content focus on these issues and attempt to find solutions, so that feedback obtained by such an interaction could be used to bridge the gap between

learning and its utility value. The Humanities and Social Sciences Departments in the Campus have been engaged in the task of studying many a socio-economic problems, faced by the society. Besides general areas, the research projects also cover a study of the problems of women, the oppressed classes of the society (both social and economic) and the problems of governance. There are a significant number of scholars working under Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship programme in various science and arts courses. The UGC has also sanctioned considerable number of Project Fellowships as part of Major Research Projects to the University Faculty. The interaction between the funding agencies and their beneficiaries and, the managerial problems in industries form other research pre-occupations of the University. The need for providing legal advice to the needy is winning the attention of the researchers.

The Academic Senate of the University has also resolved to integrate the University with the Society through its extension programmes by creating separate funding for taking up such activities.

The Science Departments are engaged in carrying out work related to the growing scientific knowledge in solving the problems of society, like the study of pollution hazards and their prevention during development by isolating and characterizing the active principles from both floral and microbial sources finding alternative energy sources, development of new varieties and hybrids in chilles, computer applications and software development, augmenting and preserving fuel supplies and other bio-mass sources, defence research, exploring non-conventional energy sources aquaculture development, liquid crystals preparation and study of their physical properties, microbiology and plant pathology, etc., all of which have a bearing on the day to day problems of society. Data mining and analysis have been the focus of several departments.

The University has exclusive centres of study such as Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Centre for Social Policy and Social Action, Mahayana Buddhism, Scientific Socialism, Disaster Mitigation Studies, Prof. K.S. Murthy Centre for Studies in Afro-Asian Philosophies, and Women's Studies, centre for conducting studies on Mahatma Jyothirao Phule and his social philosophy, Centre for Entrepreneurship Development indicating the diversified activities of the University. The UGC has sanctioned the establishment of a Gandhian Studies Centre, which has been organising a series of lectures on Gandhian philosophy. The University Library has acquired a large collection of books for the ongoing teaching and research work in the university. The library has a micro filming unit and Documentation Cell. The Library has been subscribing to as many

as 450 National and International Journals besides acquiring the back numbers of frequently used Journals and spends about Rs.60 lakhs for this purpose. A Primary Health centre is functioning on the Campus to provide medical aid to the Staff; the Instrumentation Centre and the Computer Centre which are equipped with the latest technology are functioning effectively. The Internet facilities in the campus have been modernised by introducing fibre optic connectivity. A drive is on to provide Wi-fi facility to all the Hostels in the campus.

The UGC NET Coaching Scheme, and Remedial Coaching Scheme for SC & ST Students have been yielding rich benefits. Several programmes and measures introduced by the University such as Centre for HRD, Citizens Charter, University Newsletter are being strengthened to facilitate their functional efficacy. The Directorate of Admissions set up to conduct PG and research admissions, conducted the Admission Counseling Session for the year 2017-18 smoothly and the academic schedule was started as per the designated calendar. The

University colleges conducted Induction Meeting for the newly admitted students. Emphasis is being laid on making the University acquire a true international character. There is the presence of a significant number of Foreign Students on the campus, joining various courses such as B.Tech, B.Pharmacy, M.A., M.Com., M.Sc. and in research leading to Ph.D. Another milestone in this direction has been the diversification of "On-line Education" covering many branches of education and using the advancements in ICT. Thus, ANU has been in the forefront in implementing the Mission of the Government of India, i.e., National Mission of Education through ICT (NME ICT).

4. ANU Ranking among Asian Universities

ANU has obtained second rank in South India, 22nd rank in All India level and 1st rank in Andhra Pradesh in the fresh Asian Universities ranking for 2017 announced by *Times Higher Education*. The details of the ranking are given below.

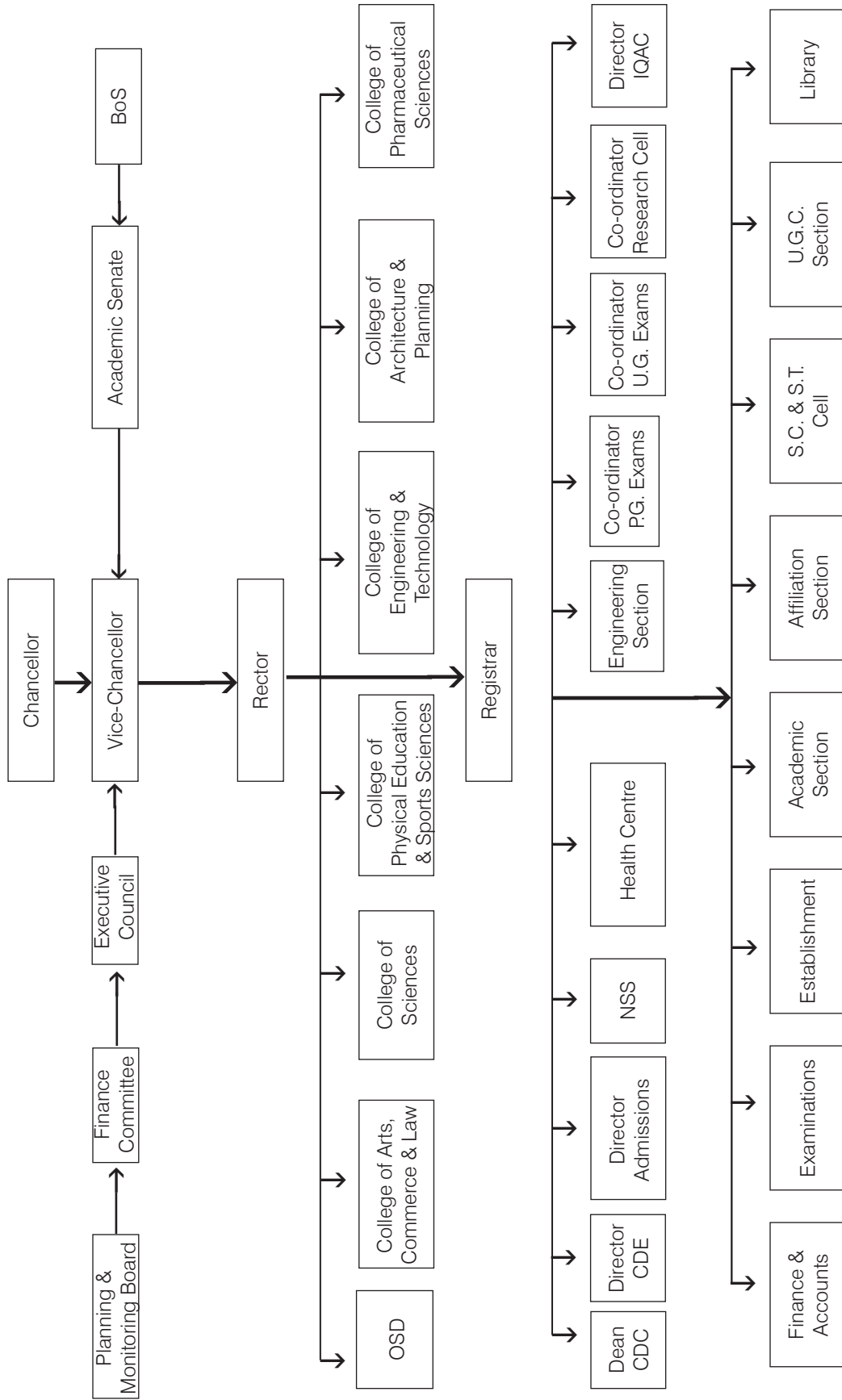

I. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

As a measure of ensuring quality, the National Knowledge Commission (NKC) has called for reforms in the Universities by way of frequent curricula revisions, introduction of choice based credit system, enhancing reliance on internal assessment, encouraging research, and reforming governance of institutions. Taking cue from these recommendations, Acharya Nagarjuna University has decided to implement the choice-based credit system (CBCS) from the academic year 2013-14 for all the post-graduate courses (As approved by the 68th Academic Senate at its meeting on 27-03-2013).

1. Why Choice Based Credit System?

- To provide academic mobility of students.
- To provide wider choice for the students in the current system.
- To make making the curriculum interdisciplinary.
- To enhance skills by including project work, entrepreneurship and vocational training.
- To improve the employability of students.
- To collaborate with the industry to foster innovations.

2. Components of CBC System

- Credit system
- Comprehensive continuous assessment
- Grading

3. What is a credit?

The term 'Credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. For instance, a five hour course per week is assigned five credits, four hour course per week is assigned four credits and two hour course per week is given two credits. However, in no instance the credits of a course can be greater than the hours allotted to it in the normal circumstances. It measures the volume of content to be delivered in the course being studied. A credit of a course also indicates the weightage of a course for calculating Grade Point Average. Thus, in each course credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of hours required per week for lectures/tutorials/lab work/field work to complete the course in a single semester. More specifically:

1 credit = 1 hour of direct teaching / week

1 credit = 2 hours of lab work /week

1 credit = 2 hours of field work /project /week

Thus, 1 credit course requires 1 hour per week during a 16 week semester and accordingly a 4 credit course requires 4 hours per week during a 16 week semester.

4. How is a Credit Measured?

Every one hour of lecture session/week amounts to 1 credit per semester. A minimum of two hour session of Tutorial or Practical/Practice session per week amounts to 1 credit per semester. A course of study may have only lecture component or tutorial or only practical/practice component or field work/project work/ tour; or combination of any of these components. The total credit earned by a student at the end of semester upon successful completion of the course is usually described as: L+T+P. The credit pattern of the course is indicated in L: T: P format. For a 4 credit course the format could be:

(a) 4:0:0 1:2:1 1:1:2 1:0:3 1:3:0 (b) 2:1:1 2:2:0 2:0:2 3:1:0 3:0:1 (c) 0:2:2 0:4:0 0:0:4 0:1:3 0:3:1

The concerned BOS will choose the convenient credit pattern for every course, based on the requirement. However, generally a course shall be for 4 or 5 credits.

5. Relationship between number of credits and marks per paper

Though credits are not directly related to marks, as a rule of thumb, we may consider 1 credit being equivalent to 25 marks. A theory paper with 4 credits may be assigned 100 marks. The concerned BOS will choose the convenient credit pattern and marks for every course, based on their requirement. Generally a course having 4 credits shall have 100 marks for theory paper and practical paper with 2 credits shall be assigned 50 marks. There may be some non-credit (NC) courses also, for which credits can be assigned, and they are to be completed satisfactorily; though not included in the grading.

6. CBCS Rules & Regulations as approved by the Academic Senate

(vide 68th Meeting of the AS held on 27-3-2013).

6.1 Evaluation

The performance of a student in each course is evaluated in terms of percentage of marks with a provision for conversion to grade points. Evaluation for each course shall be done by a continuous internal assessment by the concerned course teacher as well as by an end semester examination and will be consolidated at the end of the course. The components for continuous internal assessment are: Two tests (20 Marks); Seminar / Quiz (5 Marks); Attendance (5 Marks) Total = 30 Marks

In addition to continuous evaluation component, the end semester examination, which will be a written-type examination of at least 3 hours duration, would also form an integral component of the evaluation. The ratio of marks to be allotted to continuous internal assessment and to end semester examination is 30: 70. The evaluation of laboratory component, wherever applicable, will also be based on continuous internal assessment and on an end-semester practical examination.

6.2 Grading:

Once the marks of the continuous internal assessment and end-semester examinations for each of the courses are available, they will be added. The marks thus obtained will then be graded as per details provided in Table-1. From the first semester onwards the total performance within a semester is indicated respectively by Grade Point Average (GPA). After evaluation, assignment of Grade letter and Grade point (GP) to every paper is allotted as shown below (Table-1) at the end of each semester.

- (i) A science student has to secure a minimum of 'E' Grade in each paper and also a minimum SGPA of 6.0 points (D Grade) in any Semester to clear that Semester. Suppose any student gets 'E' Grade in two or more papers but fails to get an overall SGPA of 6.0 (D Grade), then he/she is free to reappear any of the paper(s) in which the student got E Grade of his/her choice in the subsequent examination(s).
- (ii) In case of Arts, Commerce, Law and other Social Sciences, a student has to secure a minimum of 'E' Grade in each paper and in Semester also.

- (iii) In order to fulfill “Choice Based” System, every student shall choose two Non- core papers one each in 2nd and 3rd semesters; in addition to the core papers prescribed for the course in which he/she was admitted and these two papers shall be chosen from other disciplines.
- (iv) The grades secured for the Non-Core papers will not be considered in the computation of CGPA, but student should get minimum of ‘E’ Grade to clear the Non-core papers and will be vividly displayed in the transcript and this will indicate his/her exposure to other disciplines, which will have added advantage in placements.
- (v) The departments shall have to design the time-table in such a way that the core papers are to be accommodated from Monday to Friday and Saturday is to be reserved for Non – Core papers in 2nd and 3rd semesters.

ii. Satellite Data Analysis and Application Centre (SDAAC)

Acharya Nagarjuna University opened a Satellite Data Analysis and Application Centre in collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) on the premises of University Engineering College. The Vice-Chancellor inaugurated the Centre on 2nd June 2014, which is useful academically for B.Tech., M.Tech. projects and Ph.D. works. Satellite data is being received from ISRO and analysis is done here. This data will be forwarded to different Government Departments like Mineral Dept., Fisheries Dept., Urban and Rural Planning Depts. etc. for the development of our state as well as our country.

The following are the research activities in the SDAAC, ANU during 2017-18.

Krishna District Urbanization

Brief Description:

Krishna district came into existence in the year 1859 in the composite Madras state which was then known as Masulipatnam district since Machilipatnam (Bandar) is the district headquarters. Krishna district derived its name from the mighty river Krishna which is also known as the “Blue Nile of the Deccan”. The river Krishna has profound bearing on the cultural and economic life of people living in its delta. Since the residuary Krishna district did not undergo any major jurisdictional changes except some minor changes in 1925, 1950 and 1959. In 1959 Munagala Paragana which was abridged to Krishna district in 1950 was transferred to Nalgonda district for administrative convenience. Guntur and West Godavari districts were carved out from Krishna district in the years 1904 and 1905 respectively. Since then both the districts are in existence [1].

Krishna district is one of the most developed districts in Andhra Pradesh. The District head quarter is Machilipatnam, a port town. The district is bordered by west Godavari Dist. To the East, Nalgonda and Guntur Dist. to the west, Khammam Dist. to the North and Bay of Bengal to the south [2].

Preview:

In this document urbanization of Krishna district have been detailed. That is the total occupancy of habitation in the entire district is given. The information given in this document is got by processing satellite data/ satellite images. The images analyzed are much reliable which were acquired from National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC). Twenty one scenes/ images are used to analyze the entire district. Acquired images are processed by using software called ERDAS Imagine, which is a 2015 version. All the measurements given are merely approximate values.

Data Information:

Data/ Images are collected from the PAN (MONO) sensor of CARTOSAT-1 satellite. The images collected are linear and cloud free having the resolution of 2.5 meters. All the images are captured with an angle of five degrees. Collected data is dated from 16th September 2009 to 5th July 2015. Krishna district has the latitude of 15° 43' N and 17° 10' N and Longitude of 80° 0' E and 81° 33' E therefore the scenes from the satellite are collected from path number 554 to 561, in that paths the rows collected are ; in path number 554 the rows number 318 is collected, the rows collected in path 555 is 318 and 319, rows in 556 path are 318 and 319, in the path of 557 rows collected are 318, 319 and 320, the rows 318, 319, 320, 321 are collected in the path of 558, rows collected in the path of 559 are 319, 320, 321, 322, in the path of 560 the rows collected are 319, 320, 321, 322, finally from path number 561 the row number 320 is collected.

ERDAS Imagine

ERDAS Imagine is a remote sensing application with raster graphics editor abilities designed by ERDAS for geospatial applications. The latest version is 2015.

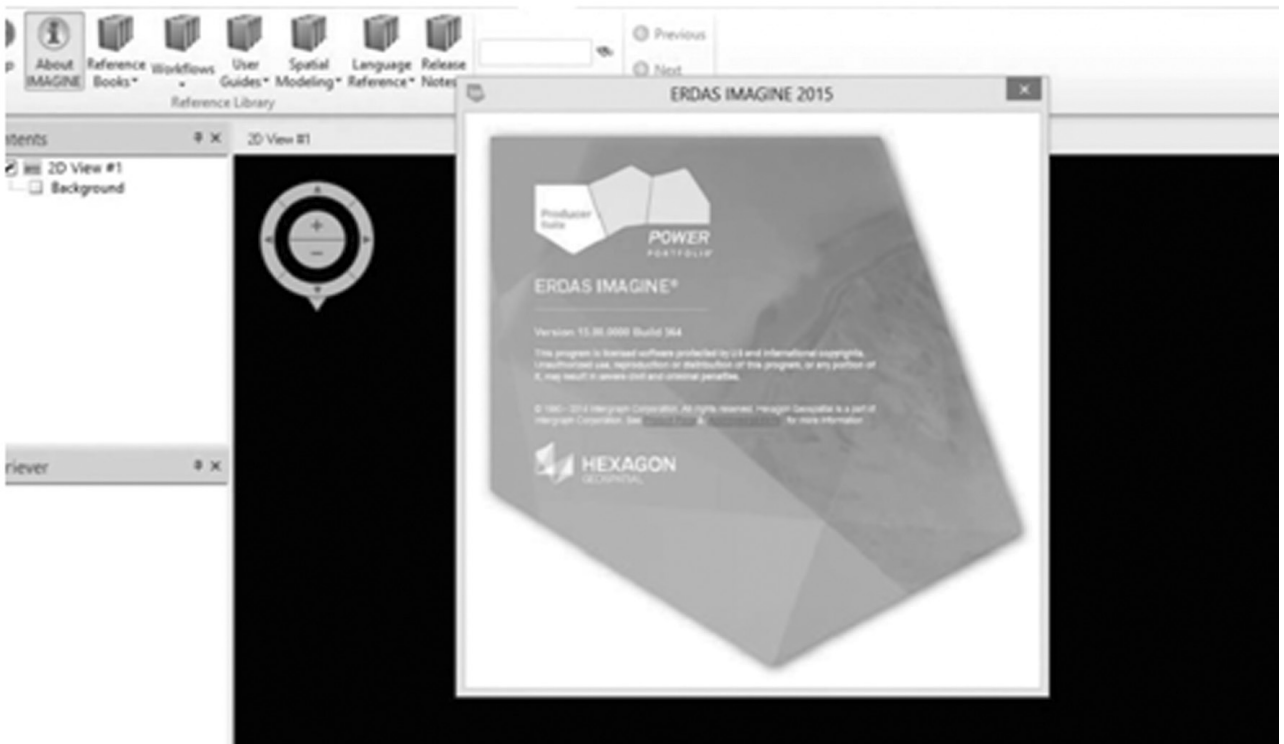


Figure 2: ERDAS Imagine workspace

Imagine is aimed mainly at geospatial raster data processing and allows users to prepare, display and enhance digital images for mapping use in geographic information system (GIS) and computer-aided design (CAD) software. It is a toolbox allowing the user to perform numerous operations on an image and generate an answer to specific geographical questions. Figure 2 shows the workspace in ERDAS Imagine. By manipulating imagery data values and positions, it is possible to see features that would not normally be visible and to

locate geo-positions of features that would otherwise be graphical. The level of brightness or reflectance of light from the surfaces in the image can be helpful with vegetation analysis, prospecting for minerals etc. Other usage examples include linear feature extraction, generation of processing work flows (spatial models in Imagine), import/export of data for a wide variety of formats, orthorectification, mosaicking of imagery, stereo and automatic feature extraction of map data from imagery.

Procedure to Process the Data:

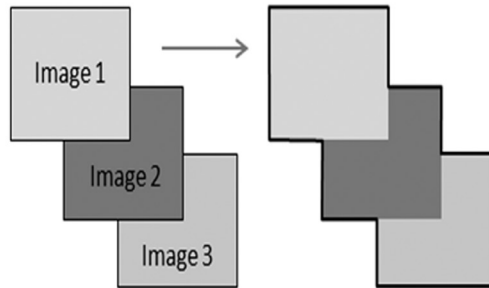


Figure 3: Image Mosaicking

Now the data available with us is a collection of twenty one individual scenes. It's impossible for an individual scene/ image to give the whole information of the entire district alone since it covers only single part of the district. Therefore to get the complete information of entire Krishna district we need to combine all the twenty one scenes. To combine the images we need to stitch them in order, this process of stitching individual images is called "Mosaic". This process of mosaicking can be performed by using ERDAS IMAGINE. In Figure 3 three individual images are added to form a single image which is called Mosaicking. In Figure 3 three individual images are added to form a single image which is called Mosaicking.

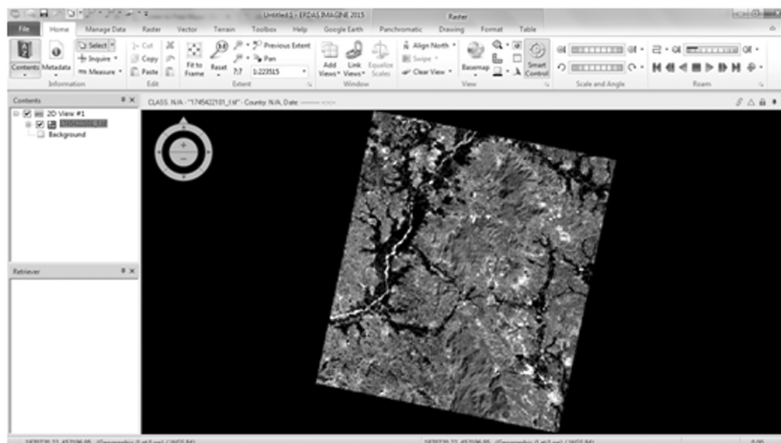


Figure 4: Individual Scene/Image

Figure 4 shows one of the twenty one individual scenes in Krishna district which belongs to the path 558 and row 320, the PLD orbit number of the scene is 32481, Sequence number of the scene is 85 bytes per pixel that is 2 bits per pixel which is having the resolution of 2.5 meters with an image format of GEOTIFF. Satellite altitude is 623168.09538594 meters with sun azimuth of 87.12886654° and sun elevation of 70.68163328° . Similarly all the other individual scenes/ images have their own orbit number, sequence number, with the same resolution of 2.5 meters, their own satellite altitude, sun azimuth, and sun elevations. All such images are added through the processes of mosaicking to extract the required information from the entire Krishna district of Andhra Pradesh.

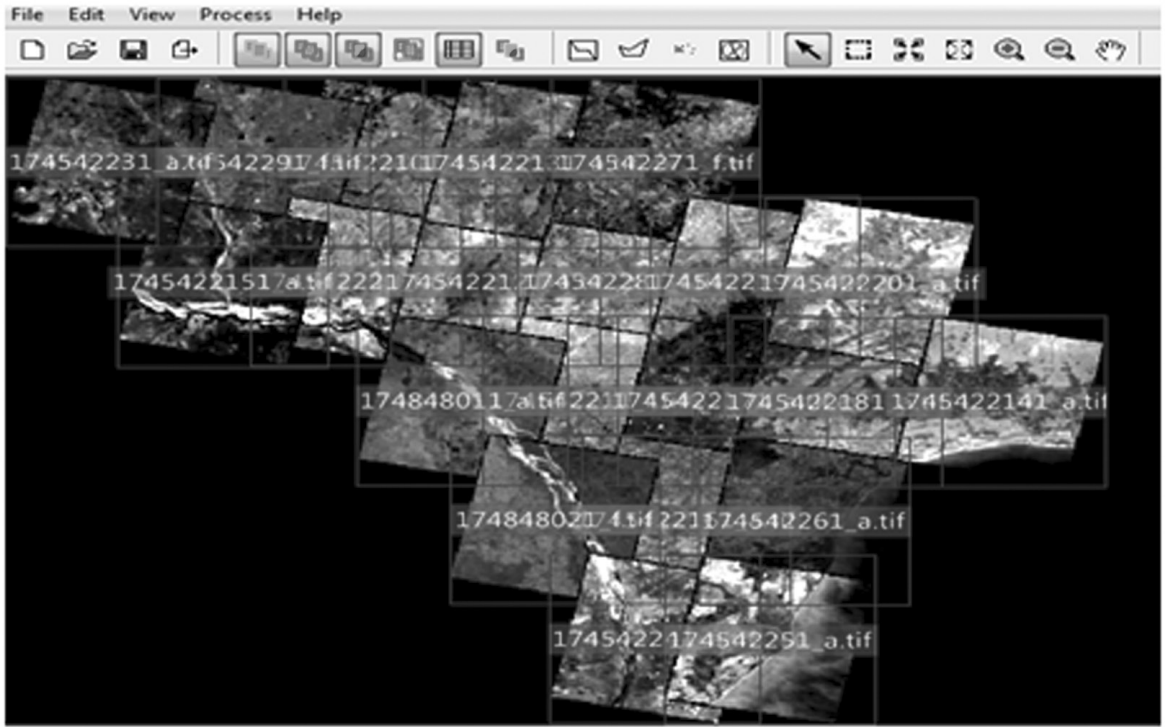


Figure 5: Non mosaicked Scenes

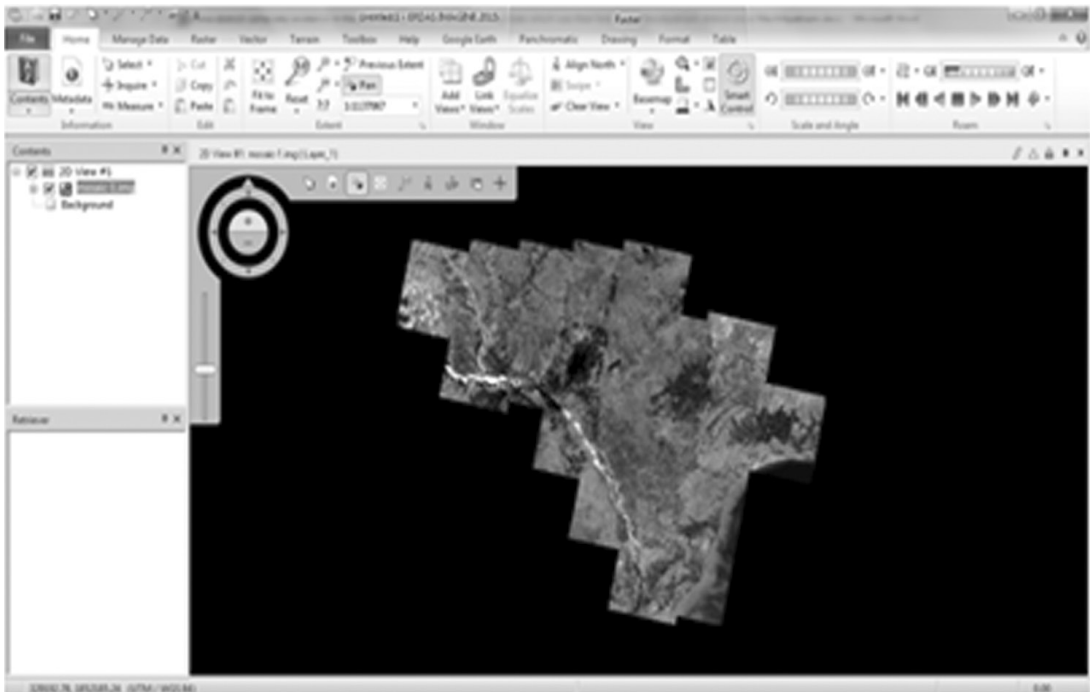


Figure 6: Mosaicked Scenes

The next step after mosaicking is our main work of modifying the image by using the suitable tools in ERDAS Imagine. If our desired task is to identify a particular area, crop land, rivers, habitants, forest etc, we can mark them by using the drawing tab in ERDAS Imagine.



The Drawing tab consists of a set of tools used for drawing various objects, as well as creating text and geometric annotation in a 2D View or Map View. When used in an AOI layer, you can select, create, and edit areas of interest (AOIs). For instance,  polyline can be used to identify rivers, roads etc.  polygon can be used to identify particular area.

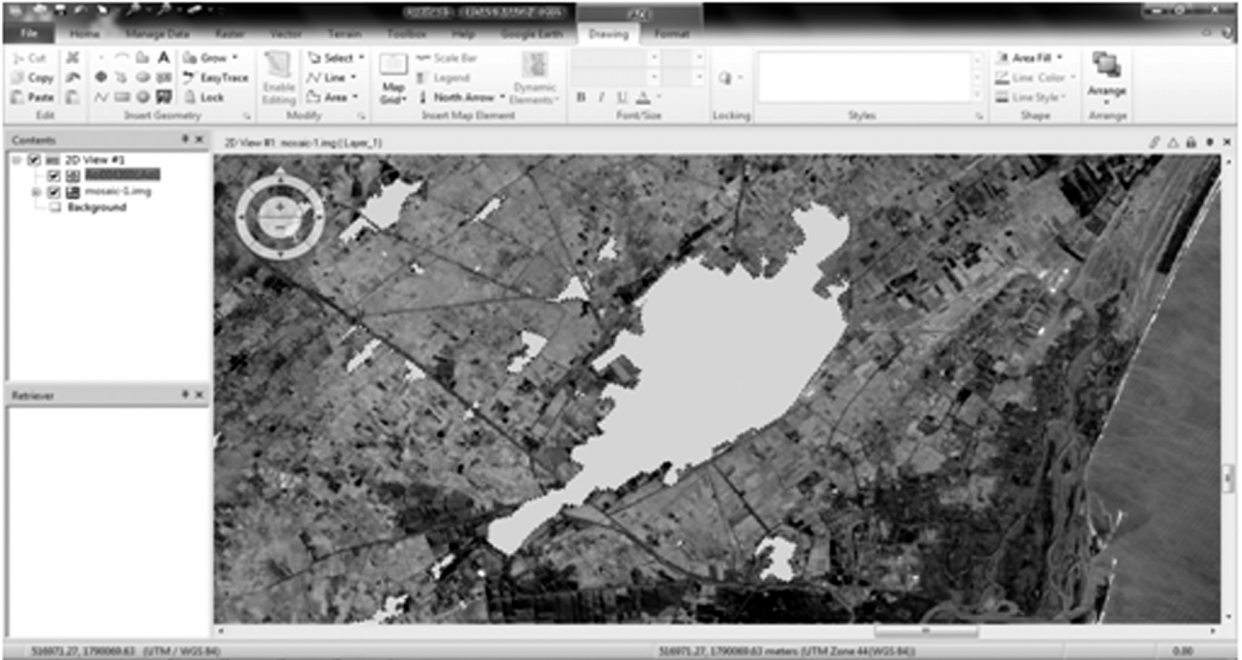



Figure 7: Polygon to mark area of interest

Figure 7 shows the image of an identified area by using the polygon (area of interest).

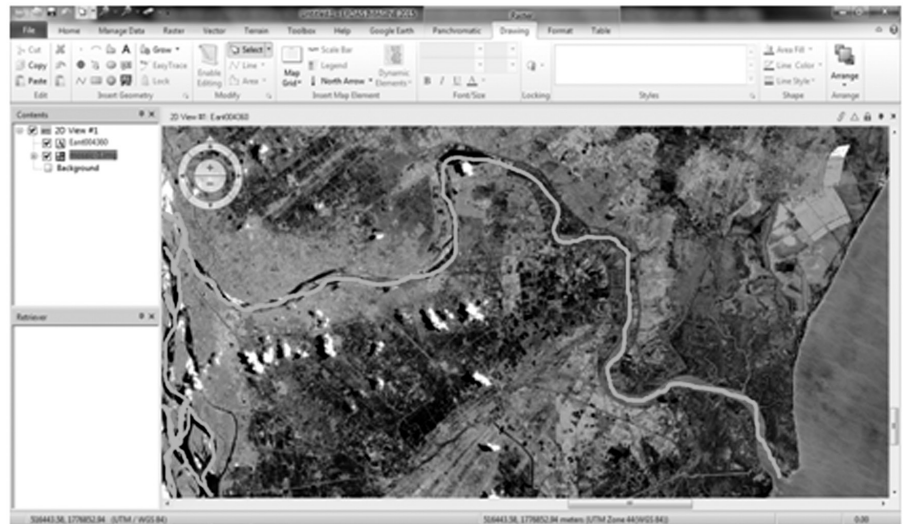


Figure 8: Free hand polyline used to mark the river

The free hand polyline  is used in figure 8 to mark the river. Likewise we can use our desired tool to modify the image. Similarly, we can get measurements for lines, points, polygons in any desired unit. For example to measure the width of the river draw a polyline from one end to the other end of the river, the line which we have drawn gives the width of the river in desired units which we need to set prior. If we want to measure the area of Small Island, polygon is drawn around the island which gives the measure of the Island.

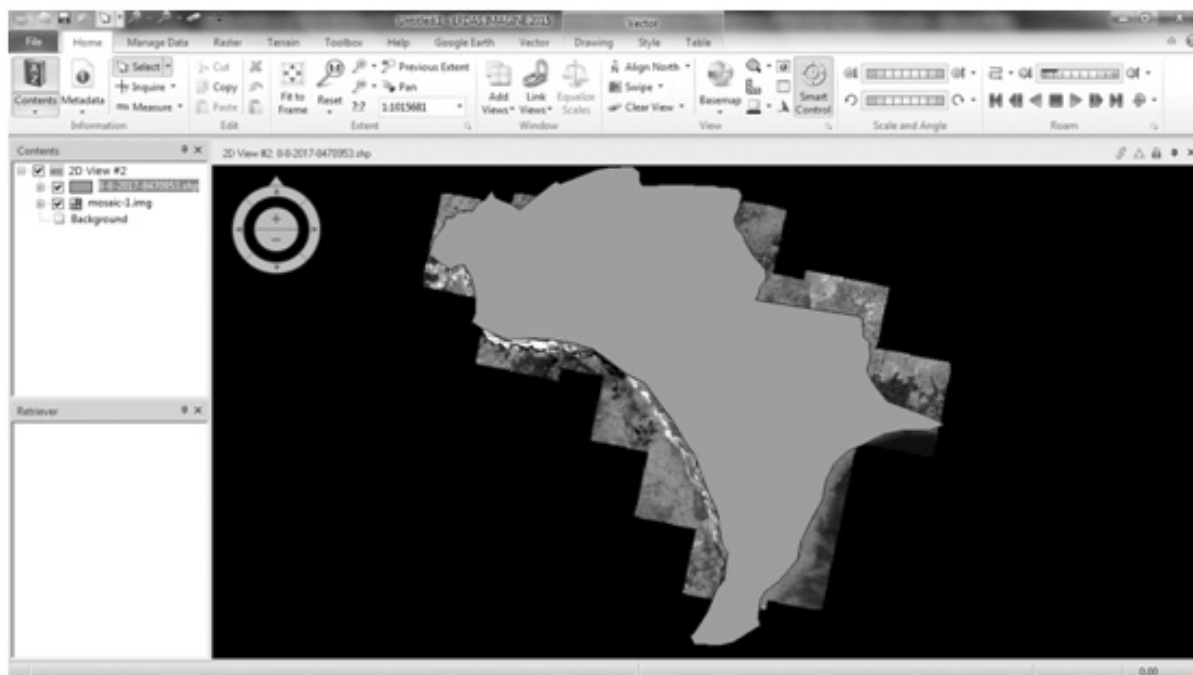


Figure 10: Krishna District

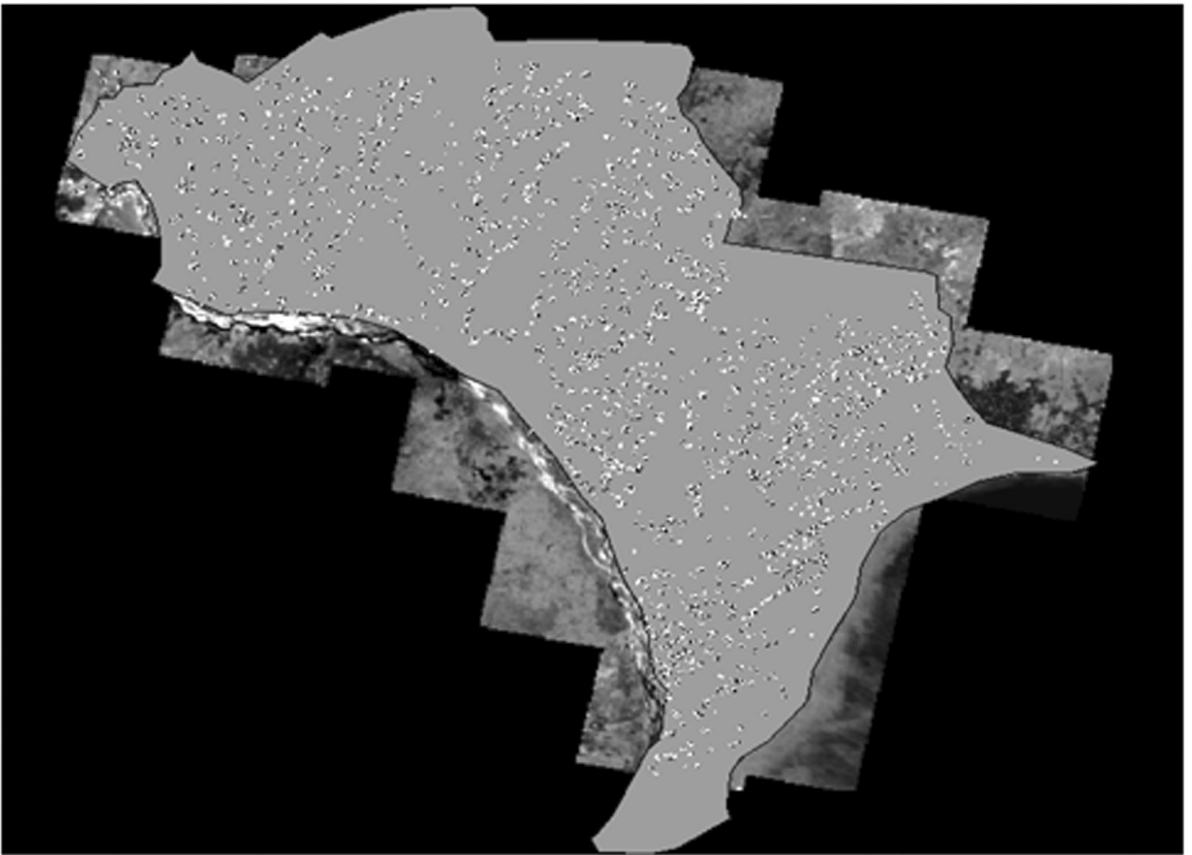


Figure 11: Habitation/ Urbanization in Krishna District

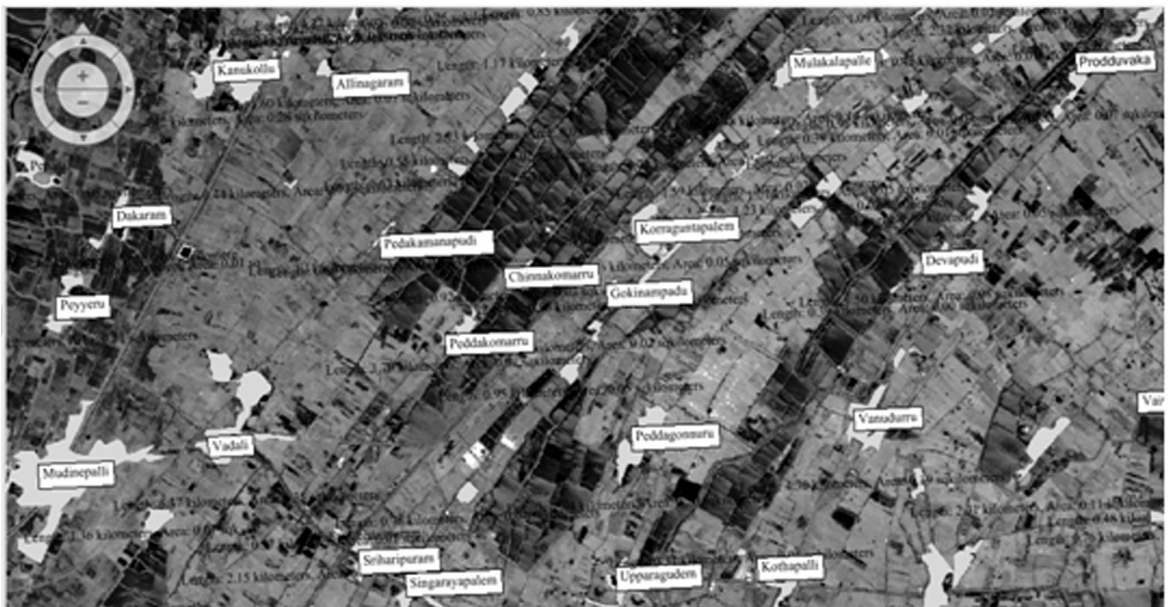


Figure 12: Identified area tagged with name (City, Town, and Village)

Figure 12 shows the identified habitant area tagged with its name. Total habitation/urbanization identified are listed below,

Some villages mentioned above when we have verified in google earth and google maps the habitation of two villages are combined. See the figure 13 below to understand better.

In the figure above, once if we check both the habitation of Akumarru and Rayavaram are combined, therefore it is difficult to identify correctly the total occupancy in the village particularly. Likewise some other villages were also combined which is difficult to measure the total area occupied by the population of the particular villages. The other problem faced while marking the habitation with the help of google earth and google maps is same name for two adjacent villages, see the figure 14 below to understand better.

From the above figure it is clear that the Kadavakollu village is marked somewhere and the habitation named after Kadavakollu is at some other place. The premise of Kadavakollu shown in google maps contains no habitation, but one of the places in the village beside the Veeravallimokhasa is labelled as Kadavakollu, whose measurements are given in the table above. It's not only the case with Kadavakollu some other villages called Arthamuru, Marrivada and some other villages are also misplaced. For some places whose names were not mentioned that is the habitations are there but no name is mentioned, in such cases we have combined those some unnamed habitations to the very nearby villages for example the other villages around Aginaparru, Kokkilgaddakothapalem, Kotcherla etc. whose names were not mentioned are also added in these villages. See the figure 15 below to understand better. The other three habitations whose names were not mentioned are also added in Aginaparru village which is shown below in Figure 15.

This is not the case with all the unnamed habitation only few unnamed habitations are added to the nearby villages but remaining all other habitations with no names is mentioned as unnamed. The total measured length of the unnamed habitations is 226.17032 Kilometres and the total area covered is of 9.1480003838 Square Kilometres. These measurements are of those unnamed areas which were not added in other villages.

By crossing all the stepping stones mentioned above the total length and area covered by the habitation/ Urbanization in the entire Krishna district is 4445.07 Kilometres and 325.033457 Square Kilometres respectively.

Krishna District Water Bodies

Water is an essential resource for all life. As time advances, water is becoming scarcer and having access to clean, safe, drinking water is limited. Fresh water is exploited by mankind in ever increasing demand for sanitation, drinking, manufacturing, leisure and agriculture. Agriculture is the largest user of the freshwater resources, consuming 70 percent. The fresh water resources (Ponds) available in the entire district of Krishna are mentioned here in this document.

Krishna district is one of the 9 coastal districts of Andhra Pradesh and agriculturally it is an important district. The district has a coastline of 88 km. It is endowed by good rainfall and surface water. The Krishna is the major river which drains the district; it is perennial in nature and flows along the western boundary of the district. South of Avanigadda the river bifurcates into four branches before it debouches into the Bay of Bengal. The other important rivers flowing in the district are Muniyeru, Tammileru and Budameru. Kolleru lake is located between Krishna and Godavari delta and spans into two districts - Krishna and West Godavari. It is the largest freshwater lake in Asia. The lake serves as a natural flood balancing reservoir for these two rivers. The lake is an important habitat for an estimated 20 million resident and migratory birds. It is known the world over for the famous Kolleru Bird Sanctuary [3].

The district is served with both surface and ground water irrigation sources. Major and medium irrigation projects exist in the district. Irrigation in the district is mainly from the network of canals in the delta area fed by the Krishna River. East main canal of Prakasam (Krishna) Barrage irrigates entire delta area through a network of its three canals viz., Eluru canal, Ryves canal and Bandar canal [3].

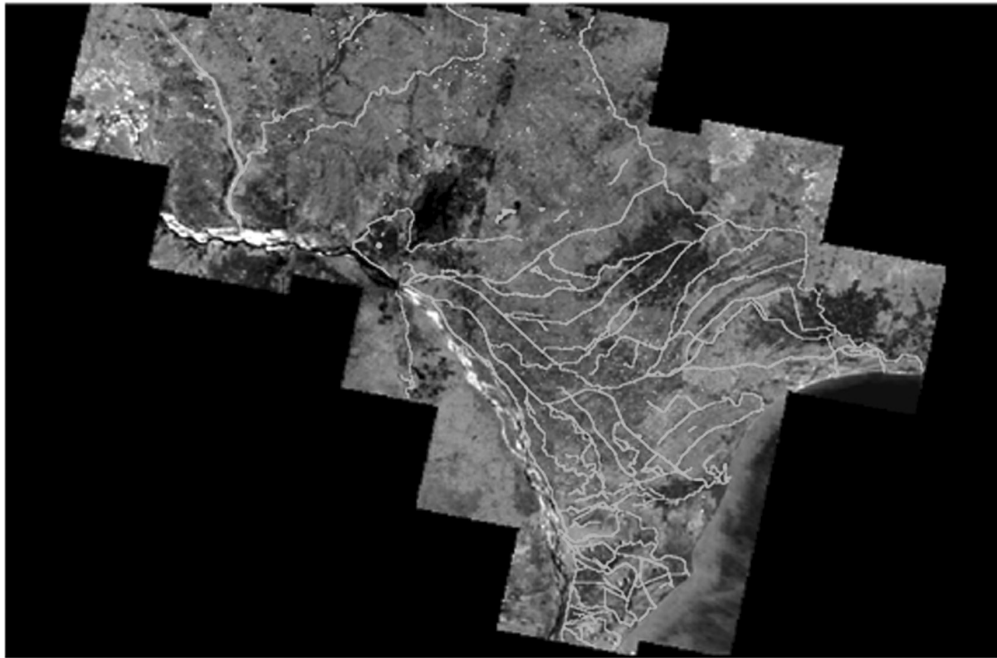


Figure 16: Water Bodies in Krishna district.

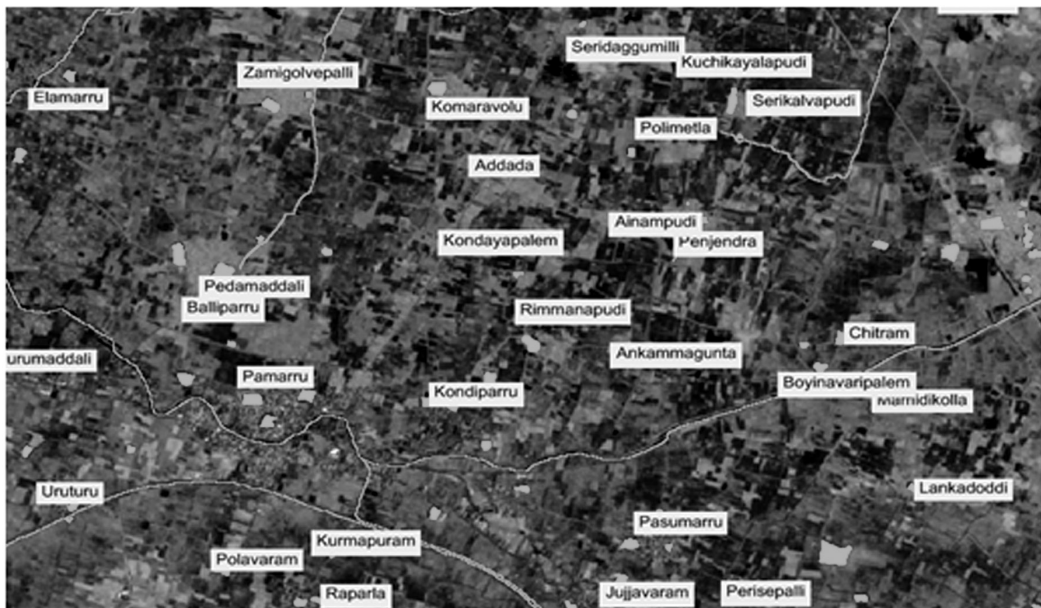


Figure 17: Ponds and there corresponding village names.

Figure 17 shows the image of ponds and the village names where they have situated. Total number of ponds identified in the district have mentioned in the table below,

From Table 2 it is clear that the total ponds identified in the Krishna district near the habitants are 1835 ponds in number excluding the ponds near crop lands, here in the above table mentioned unnamed as 198 which means the areas whose names were not identified is mentioned as unnamed and the total number of ponds under these unidentified areas are 198 in number.

Acharya Nagarjuna University Online Courses (ANU MOOCs)

Acharya Nagarjuna University has taken measures to design/develop MOOCs in ANU and has authorized the Director, ISC to work on the project and required facilities are provided to develop free online courses.

Salient features of ANU MOOCs:

1. Title of the Project: The initiative be called as “MOOCs”, o be developed on the lines of reputed world class universities like Harvard, MIT etc.
2. Who will develop the courses: The faculty members form ANU and its affiliated colleges will be trained and motivated to develop ANU online courses. Efforts of faculty members will be channeled through Nodal Office at ISC and interested faculty members will be asked to register their proposals, to avoid duplication of effort. The content given by the faculty members will be divided into number of available in ISC online education and also in the Dept. of Journalism and Mass Communication. The final version of the content will be evaluated/ certified by subject experts and language editors and then only it will be placed in the university website for free access to anyone, anytime, like any other MOOCs.

3. For Whom: The courses will cover all faculties and are offered free of cost to all to learn the subject. Those who want ANU certification will be required to pay Rs. 500 for Indian students from within the country or US\$20 for all International Students.
4. Procedure to be followed by students: Interested students are required to register online for the selected courses in the university website/ ISC website and after successful registration every user will be given a user name and password for accessing the courses.
5. Assigning credits to online courses: At present all PG courses in ANU are offered through CBCS and in case of two year PG Courses, every student has to select any course from the list of approved noncore papers in II and III semesters. The University will decide the number of credits to be allotted for that course depending on the coverage of syllabus.
6. Evaluation and certification: The content developer must also develop question bank in the form of MCQs along with the course content for the purpose of evaluation. The built in mechanism in the software will enable the generation of question paper and system will enable the generation of question paper and system will itself evaluate the performance and result will be displayed instantaneously without human intervention. System generated certification or hard copy of certification may be issued by the university with the signature of authorized authority of the university.
7. Time Line: some of the courses can be offered w.e.f., 1st September, 2015.

University has taken a decision to design and develop e- content by collaborating with a Technology partner for selected courses on trial basis during the academic year 2014-15. It started 34 programs, which includes UG and PG programs. ISC developed e-content for 229 theory papers, 19 lab papers and recorded 87 video lectures for various courses. 716 students have joined in these programs. University received Global HR Excellence Award and IMC IT award in 2015 for its contribution to ICT enabled education.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

(A Post-Accreditation Quality Sustenance Activity)

Acharya Nagarjuna University was accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2003 with B++ for the first time. As per the guidelines of the NAAC every accredited Higher Educational Institution has to establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Accordingly Acharya Nagarjuna University established IQAC soon after assessment by NAAC in 2003. It was inaugurated by Dr. V. S. Prasad, the then Director of NAAC. Acharya Nagarjuna University is one of the foremost accredited educational institutions to have established IQAC for a continuous monitoring of quality education. The University was accredited with “B” Grade in 2010 (2nd Cycle).

Apart from the basic objectives of IQAC, some of its functions are:

Recording and monitoring quality measures of the institution; acting as a nodal agency of the institution for quality related activities; Preparation of Annual Quality Assurance Report, Half-yearly Report and such other reports as may be decided from time to time. IQAC also shoulders the responsibility of other quality assurance activities of the Campus that include maintaining and processing the Career Advancement Schemes of Faculty on a continuous basis. It promotes the policy of imparting quality education in the institutions affiliated to Acharya Nagarjuna University. The necessary database useful for presentation at Governmental and other levels to assess the quality performance of the University is also being undertaken by IQAC. It is also involved in distributing Questionnaires to the students to get their evaluation of faculty and the courses. The results of the feedback analysis are then circulated to the faculty.

An associated advisory body called Quality Advisory Committee (QAC) was also constituted for guiding IQAC on the right path which was reconstituted in 2016. IQAC, along with a duly constituted steering committee, played an important role in the reaccreditation process of Acharya Nagarjuna University (3rd Cycle) in the year 2016. A committee comprising Deans of faculties and others had been constituted to take care of the seven criteria in the preparation of the Self-Study Report. The Advisory Board of the IQAC had several meetings with the Vice-Chancellor in chair to review the status of the criteria-wise preparation of Self Study Report and the Evaluative Reports of the Departments. Several workshops and awareness programmes have been organized by the IQAC in this connection.

The NAAC Peer Team visited ANU during 5 – December, 2016. Subsequently NAAC accredited ANU with CGPA of 3.08 on seven point scale at “A” Grade. This grade is valid for a period of 5 years upto 15th December, 2021, as per the certificate given on 16.12.2016.

DSIR – PRISM SCHEME

The DSIR (Department of Scientific & Industrial Research, Govt. of India), New Delhi, during XII five year plan initiated a scheme entitled, “PRISM (*Promoting Innovations in Individuals, Start-ups and MSMEs*)” with an aim to promote innovations by supporting financially the individual innovators. In order to implement the scheme, the DSIR has identified the centres called TOCICs (TePP Outreach cum Cluster Innovation Centres) in the country.

The Acharya Nagarjuna University has been allotted one such centre (ANU-TOCIC). The centre calls for fresh innovative proposals from innovators and arranges their processing for financial support by DSIR. It also provides counseling and mentoring facility to the innovators in addition to incubation facilities.

Who can apply for financial support?

- I. Any Indian citizen having innovative idea and wish to translate his / her idea into working prototype/ model / process.
- II. Any public funded institution / organization / society registered under the societies Registration Act, 1860 or Indian Trusts Act, 1882 and engaged in promotion of innovation.

In the closing ceremony the prizes were distributed to medal winners.

The newly constructed synthetic track was inaugurated by **Sri Ganta Srinivasa Rao**, Hon'ble Minister for HRD, while the newly arranged Flood Lighting system was inaugurated by **Sri Kollu Ravindra**, Hon'ble Minister of Sports on 15th July, 2017.

Inauguration of Flood Lighting System

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has sanctioned an amount of Rs.7.92 crores for floodlighting of the new synthetic track. ANU and SAAP have entrusted the responsibility of providing Sports Lighting of International Standards to the Synthetic Track to the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) on 31.03.2017 and complete the work by 14-7-2017.

Highlights of sports lighting:

1. The sports lighting has been designed with state-of-the art Technology with 2 KW metal halide fittings on 45 mtrs. high masts. The fittings were imported from Russia.
2. The lighting has been designed to cater to the requirements of sport events as per IAAF guidelines follows:
 - a. For Daily practice with 500 lux
 - b. For National tournaments with 1000 lux
 - c. For International events / tournaments with 2000 lux which suits the latest Slow Motion High Definition Cameras.

3. A power house complex with 500 KVA transformer has been provided which not only caters to the daily practice requirements of the track lighting but also to the other ongoing buildings like Fitness Centre, etc.
4. Dedicated generator sets of 500 + 750 = 1250 KVA capacity have been provided at the substation for taking care of National and International sports events.
5. Even though six months time was given in the approved PE for completion of work CPWD completed the sports lighting project by 14-7-2017 within 3.5 months which is a record time.

I. UGC NET COACHING

UGC NET Coaching for SC/ST/OBC & Minority students during year 01-17-2017 to 30-06-2018 was conducted in two spells for the academic year 01-07-2017 to 30-06-2018. 1st spell was conducted from 15-08-2017 to 31-10-2017 with exam on 05-11-2017 and the II spell was conducted from 01-03-2018 to 20-04-2018 Exam conducted on 26-06-2018. In both spells 100 students were attended to this coaching programme. Free lectures were given by reputed resource persons in various disciplines along with paper I general studies. They are Telugu, English, Hindi, History, Education, Political Science, Public Administration, Economics, Sociology, Social Work, Physical Education, Library Science, Commerce & Management, Computer Science, Environmental Sciences, Journalism and Mass Communication, population studies for the optional paper II and paper I General Studies. Printed and photo copied Study material also distributed to all the students at the free of cost. Some of the students were (Telugu, English Environmental Sciences and library Science) selected who have attended this coaching programme (UGC NET coaching for SC/ST/OBC & Minority students) 30% of the students benefited and selected in SET Examination because of this (UGC NET coaching for SC/ST/OBC & Minority students) programme.

II. REMEDIAL COACHING FOR SC / ST / OBC (NON-CREAMY LAYER) & MINORITY COMMUNITY STUDENTS

1. Education is meant not only to nurture the excellence already in a gifted person but also to uplift the not-so-gifted, so that he / she is equipped to safeguard his / her interests in independent democratic India. The Constitution of India recognizes the SCs and STs as the two most backward groups needing special assistance and protection. Further, democracy demands the necessity to protect and foster the interests and needs of the minority groups. In order to enable students belonging to SC / ST / OBC (non-creamy layer) / Minority communities, who need remedial coaching to come up to the 30 Level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently and to reduce their failure and drop-out rate, the UGC provides financial assistance for conducting special classes outside the regular timetable during the Twelfth Plan. Students belonging to Other Backward Classes and General Candidates may also be allowed the benefit of such coaching classes. A nominal fee (not exceeding the monthly tuition fee) may be charged from the general candidates. However, physically challenged students and students who are General Candidates coming from families with income below the poverty line (as guided by the State/ UT/ Central Government) will be exempted from paying the fee.
2. Objectives of Remedial Coaching to be organized at Undergraduate / Postgraduate level with a view to
 - i. Improving academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects.
 - ii. Raising their level of comprehension of basic subjects and to provide a stronger foundation for further academic work.
 - iii. Strengthening their knowledge, skills and attitudes in such subjects, where quantitative and qualitative techniques and laboratory activities are involved so that proper guidance and training provided under the programme may enable the students to come up to the level.

In XII Five Year Plan, the UGC decided to make special allocation for promoting higher education for SC,ST,BC and Minorities. The Commission has been providing separate assistance to the University for Remedial coaching at the PG level. Keeping in view the need of improving the academic skills and raise the level of comprehension to reduce the failure and the dropout rate of the SC/ST/BC and Minority students, UGC funded Remedial coaching classes were conducted both in ANU and Ongole P.G. Centre campus Dr. V. Venkata Ratnamma Rao, Dept. of Zoology, ANU Co-ordinated these classes.

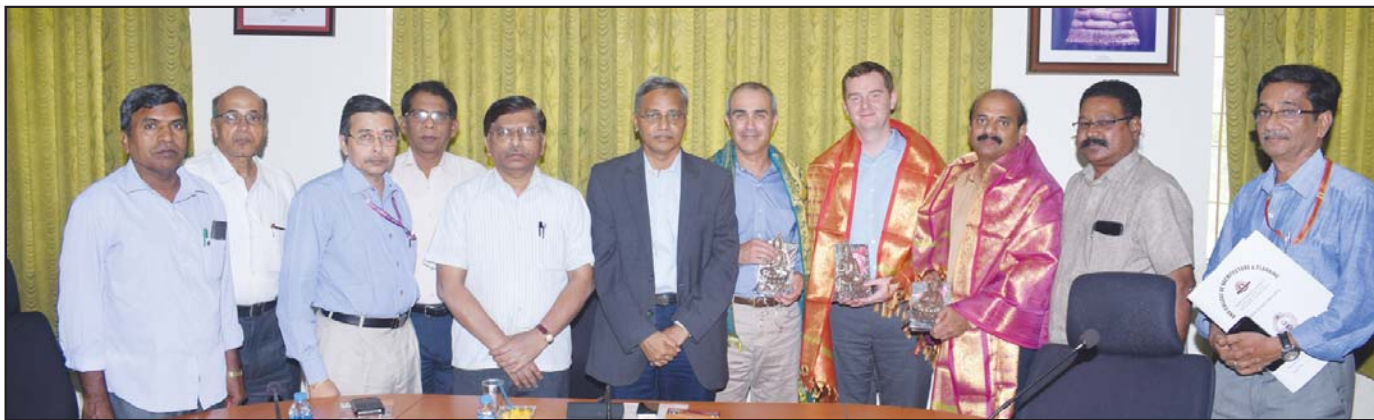
