University has completed 45 years of existence it was inaugurated on 11th September, 1976 by the former President of India, Sri. Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed. About Centre

Centre for Women's Studies was founded in 1988 with an objective to promote gender sensitivity among the people under the jurisdiction of Acharya Nagarjuna University. The centre is aimed at the activities of teaching, research, training and extension. The thrust area of the centre is to conduct studies on role of women in the social movements and their role in the development of this particular region. It has undertaken certain important projects and conducted seminars on gender studies and also field based workshops. The centre is keen in promoting awareness against eve teasing and ragging and it is interlinked with the legal cell, which was also initiated by the University. And Centre is also offering research programmes at interdisciplinary level.

About the Seminar

Every woman has the right to live her life safely with free of violence. Violence against women is like a global epidemic which influences the physical, psychological, sexual, and economic life of the female. A woman has violence throughout her entire lifespan, from parents, husband, children and other relatives. Violence against women means any act of gender-based violence that results in physical or psychological harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion, or arbitrary deprivation of liberty whether occurring in public or private life. Women are subjected to "structural violence" which results from sexism, rape, domestic violence, psychological violence, and other acts of violence resulting from the social structure. Structural violence is a demon against women that is devouring the society. The World Health Organization (WHO) categorized Violence against women into five stages of the life cycle: 1) pre-birth, 2) infancy, 3) girlhood, 4) adolescence and adulthood 5) elderly. Women experience violence in many ways, from physical abuse to sexual assault and from financial abuse to sexual harassment or human trafficking. Whatever form it takes, violence against women can have serious long-term physical and emotional effects. Structural violence impacts all aspects of women's lives, their health, safety and that of their children and also society as a whole. Multiple kind of violence stem from the interaction of

patriarchy with structural factors such as culture and economic opportunity. To change a cultural mindset at the roots of society with the people, the combined efforts of government, NGOs and family, the women have to take a major step to fight this dragon. In view of all these, it is high time that we need to chart the future action leading to promotion of women empowerment by refraining from various kinds of violence. The proposed national seminar will provide a platform and an opportunity to exchange the views and identify the priority areas of future research.

It should be organized in the following order: Title, name (s) of author(s) and his/her(their) complete affiliation(s) including zip code(s). And it should contain Abstract, Introduction, Objectives, Methodologies, Results and Discussion, Conclusion and References.

Originality

All submission papers must be original and should not have been copied, published or accepted in a journal or conference proceedings, or presented any another conferences.

Abstract

Abstract of the research paper containing not more than 300 words. Paper or abstract should be sent to the Director, National Seminar on or before 01.02.2023, through E-mail : nsviwe2023@gmail.com The Abstract should be neatly typed in M.S word, 1.5 line space, 12 size font in Times New Roman. Please Note that the abstract should be typed in only one paragraph without Figures, Tables and Acknowledgments.
